Ordering:

- ✓ Order deadline is Friday March 29th. Heirloom apples are available in limited quantities on a first come first serve basis as they were custom grafted in July 2017
- ✓ Fill out attached order form on next page
- ✓ Submit order form by mailing or delivering to:

- ✓ Must submit a check **made out to Watauga NCCES** at time of ordering, we are unable to accept debit/credit cards
- ✓ If paying with cash in person, please have correct change

Delivery:

- ✓ Pick up plants Friday April 12th from 12:00pm until 6:00pm or Saturday April 13th from 9:00am-12:00pm
- ✓ Pick up will be behind our offices, at loading dock, address is 252 Poplar Grove Rd.
- ✓ Condition of plants cannot be guaranteed after pick up dates as some plants are bare root and need to be kept moist and planted soon.

What to expect from the plants:

- ✓ Blueberries will be sold in 1 gal containers with soil
- ✓ All other plants will be sold bare root (no soil attached to roots) The root system will need to be kept moist and should be planted as soon as possible.
- ✓ All plant varieties are selected based on their hardiness, disease resistance, and other qualities, based on recommendations from NC State specialists, and multiple other research based university publications.
- ✓ All plants are best suited for full sun locations.
